Title: BRAKE IRVA grant contribution

Category of Decision / Business Area Impact: Finance

Executive Summary:

Brake's National Road Victim Service (NRVS) is the **leading, largest, road victim support provider for the UK**. It has a 20-year record of accredited, road victim service provision using the **evidence-based established model** of care called case-managed care.

This care provision is not a helpline – it is case-managed care from day one for as long as required (sometimes more than a year) prior to safe exit. Care is provided by assigning a **named, trained, paid caseworker** to a victim. BRAKE approached the PCC with a proposal to fund a dedicated Dyfed Powys Independent Road Victim Advocate (IRVA) for a 12 month period, working with Dyfed Powys Police directly in terms of referrals of victims. The proposal directly meets the Police and Crime Plan under Priority 1 ensuring victims are supported.

The PCC has suggested to fund £39,680.45 towards the project from the Driver Retraining Reserves budget for a period of 12 months. The project will be monitored on a quarterly basis over this period to evaluate success and progress.

Recommendation:

It is recommended that a grant is awarded to BRAKE for a period of 12 months for the sum of £39,680.45 from the Driver Retraining reserves budget
