Opinion Research Services (ORS) are an independent social research company and Market Research Society (MRS) Company Partner working on behalf of Dyfed Powys Police to conduct Victim Satisfaction Surveys. The above results are for the first 3 months of surveying conducted by ORS. 62.8% (71) victims of crime were satisfied or very satisfied overall during this first quarter of surveying with 100% (2) of Hate Crime Victims satisfied or very satisfied overall. The surveys were conducted with victims who reported to Dyfed Powys Police between 1st January 2023 and 31st March 2023.

Expectations published to improve the approach to Domestic Abuse

A new document has been published, setting out expectations for those who respond to, supervise, and investigate Domestic Abuse, so we can continue to improve practices in this priority area.

The below results are for the first three months of surveying conducted by ORS. The Surveys were conducted with victims for offences reported to Dyfed Powys Police between 1st January 2023 and 31st March 2023.

DOMESTIC ABUSE: Trialling a virtual response to victims

We're launching a two-month pilot of a service called Rapid Video Response as part of the force's focus on working towards the elimination of domestic abuse, stalking and harassment.

The service gives victims who report domestic-related incidents which do not require an urgent response the option to speak to an officer over a video call. Those who choose this will receive an immediate video service rather than a delayed physical attendance.

The two-month pilot, which goes live on April 24, will be carried out in Carmarthenshire, with the aim of rolling the service out across the force.

Victims will be able to get a frontline response when they need it, without delay. An immediate video response allows for earlier identification of risk and assessment of evidential opportunities.

Man sentenced to five years for drug dealing in Aberystwyth

- A man who was arrested after being spotted taking drugs in the street in Aberystwyth was found to be an active dealer and has now been jailed for five-and-a-half years.
- Officers searched the suspects home where they found a bag containing 3g of herbal cannabis, as well as a small set of weighing scales and 0.77g of cannabis under his bed. Officers then found 101,000 blue and white tablets in various containers, including two large buckets, each containing thousands of the pills.

OP ACCENT: Kyle Bevan guilty of murdering two-year-old Lola James

A mother and her boyfriend have been convicted over the death of her "happy, busy and good little" two-year-old girl.

Kyle Bevan, aged 31, fatally injured Lola James by repeatedly hitting her in a savage attack that left his victim limp and unresponsive in the early hours of Friday, 17 July, 2020. Bevan has now been convicted of her murder following a three-week trial at Swansea Crown Court, while her mother, aged 30, has been convicted of causing or allowing the death of a child.

Teen jailed for knifepoint robbery and assault on river path

A TEENAGER has been jailed for a knifepoint robbery and assault on the Aberaeron river path. The 17-year-old pleaded guilty to assault causing actual bodily harm, affray, possessing an offensive weapon, and possession of cannabis. He was sentenced to a four-month detention and training order last year. Detective Inspector Adam Cann said: "These were two particularly nasty incidents which were carried out in broad daylight in a public place, causing understandable concern in the area."

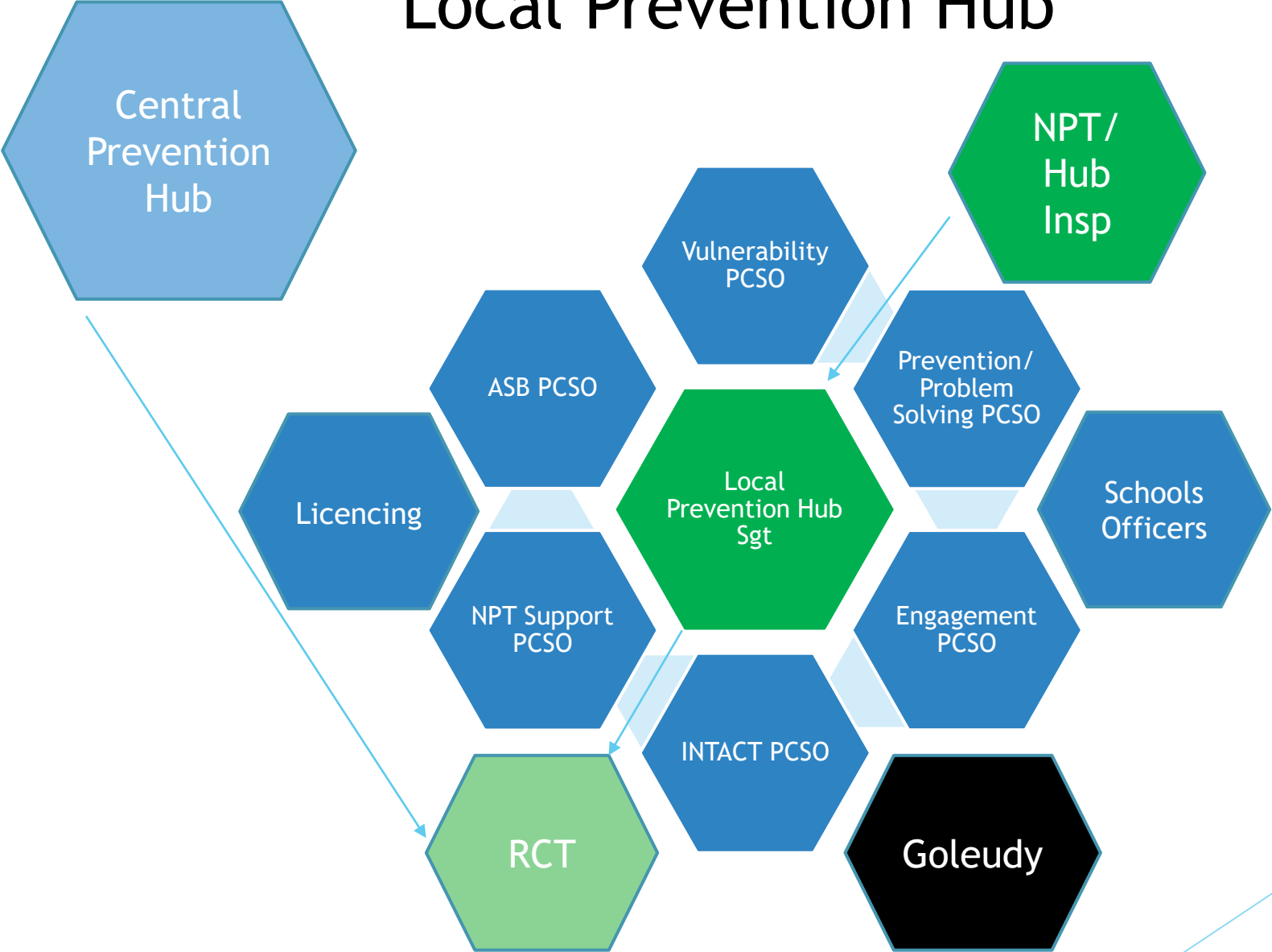

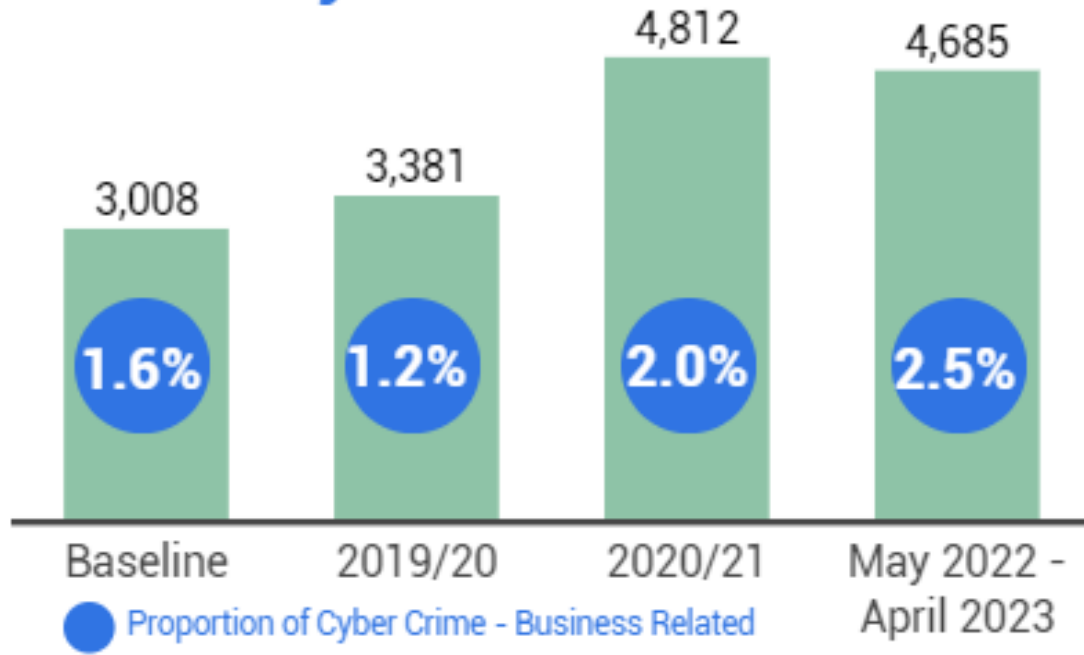
