Executive Summary: The original proposals relating to the creation of the National Police Air Service (NPAS) were included in a letter received from Chief Constable Alex Marshall on 27.06.11. Discussions have ensued since and a revised agreement was received from the NPAS team on 28th July 2014.

Recommendation: That the Police and Crime Commissioner and the Chief Constable agree to join NPAS.

NATIONAL POLICE AIR SERVICE - FINANCIAL UPDATE

1. Background

The original proposals relating to the creation of the National Police Air Service (NPAS) were included in a letter received from Chief Constable Alex Marshall of Hampshire Constabulary on the 27th June 2011. Discussions around the various options available in terms of joining NPAS have continued since this time.

This paper has been prepared to enable discussion on recent developments in respect of NPAS following a meeting of the 16th of January 2014 and in the light of the receipt of further costing information and a revised agreement received from the NPAS team dated 6th August 2014.

2. The Existing Budget and Actuals

The current budgeted estimates for air support are as follows:

3. Cost implications of the updated proposals

The current proposal from NPAS is based upon 349 flying hours per annum from the Pembrey Airbase with a rotary wing aircraft. Under the current funding model, Dyfed Powys will pay £891,000 per annum for the service at 2015/16 prices. In addition to this, an enhanced service will also be available in terms of emergency response outside the normal hours of operation from St Athan.

As part of the funding settlement for 2012/13, the Minister of State for Policing and Criminal Justice, Nick Herbert announced reductions to the then Authority's capital grant funding allocations in order to support the establishment of NPAS. The following reductions were applied to capital grants for Dyfed Powys Police:

This would bring the total cost of NPAS to around £931K for 2015/16 if lost capital allocations were taken into consideration.

It is expected that the Police and Crime Commissioner will hand over the current aircraft to the NPAS and receive compensation totalling £319K payable over the next four years as follows:

The Commissioner should receive a new aircraft during the 2015/16 financial year. The exact timing of receipt is unclear at present however the current aircraft and service will be retained and paid for locally until this time.

Under the agreement the Pembrey Air Support Building will remain under the ownership of the Commissioner and running costs including utilities etc. will be paid for by NPAS from within the above financial limits. The agreement sets out the detailed arrangements pertaining to staffing, insurance, governance and operational arrangements in place nationally and locally for the arrangement.

The table shows that the proposal from NPAS would result a reduction in the revenue budget of some £275K for the 2015/16 financial year.

A revised charging methodology aligned more closely to flying hours is being considered by the NPAS Board for 2015/16 and these could have an impact on the savings figures shown in this Table.

4. Hosting NPAS and residual issues

The West Yorkshire Police Force host the NPAS service and the governance arrangements are as set out in the attached document. The provision of the service from NPAS is of equivalent scope and coverage to that currently provided from an operational perspective and the detailed deployment procedures are set out in the agreement.
