- 2. Has the PCC/Mayor/Authority given any consideration to any waiting lists for rape and sexual violence support, and how such waiting lists can be mitigated against. If so, please provide details.

Response 2:

I can confirm that the Office of the Police and Crime Commissioner does hold the information requested the details of which are as follows:

The Police and Crime Commissioner (PCC) engages with key stakeholders including Health and Local Authorities to provide a regional approach to tackling violence against women, sexual violence and domestic violence. This includes consideration of the evidence and demand for services, along with reviews of service models and budget arrangements. The PCC in particular funds immediate interventions to meet the short term needs of the victims and to secure best evidence at court, to provide better supported witnesses in the criminal justice process and to increase victims' confidence in accessing services and reporting crimes. This particular element of the service has not reported any waiting lists.

In addition to the above the Police and Crime Commissioner wishes to add that the Commissioner is always available to discuss specific concerns the public, professionals or victims have in regard to this issue.
