Request:

Please detail a list of all expenditure for the last 3 financial years from money retained by Dyfed Powys force from the Proceeds of Crime Act. Please provide the name of the expense, a description of what it is where necessary or detailed, quantity where relevant, and the amount paid.

Response:

Section 1 of the Freedom of Information Act 2000 places two duties on public authorities. Unless exemptions apply, the first duty at Section 1(1) (a) is to confirm or deny whether the information specified in a request is held. The second duty at Section 1(1) (b) is to disclose information that has been confirmed as being held.

I can confirm that information is held by the Office of the Police and Crime Commissioner, the details of which are as follows:

Financial Year	POCA Expenditure
2014/2015	£71,412.90 – 20 Community projects funded
2015/2016	£87,800.20 – 23 Community projects funded
2016/2017	£84,593.05 – 21 Community projects funded

Please note: The figures provided above from POCA expenditure differ slightly to the figures outlined in the hyperlink; this is due to the fact that once awarded, some of the grants were unable to meet and fulfil their grant terms and conditions and so therefore did not receive the grant funding.

In addition to the above Dyfed Powys police force can neither confirm nor deny that it holds any other information with regard to an exempt body as the duty in Section 1(1)(a) of the Freedom of Information Act 2000 does not apply by virtue of the following exemption:

Section 23(5) Information supplied by, or concerning, certain Security Bodies

Section 23 is a class based absolute exemption and there is no requirement to consider the public interest in this case.

It should be noted that owing to the systems adopted by Dyfed-Powys Police in relation to the recording of such matters the information provided may or may not be accurate.
